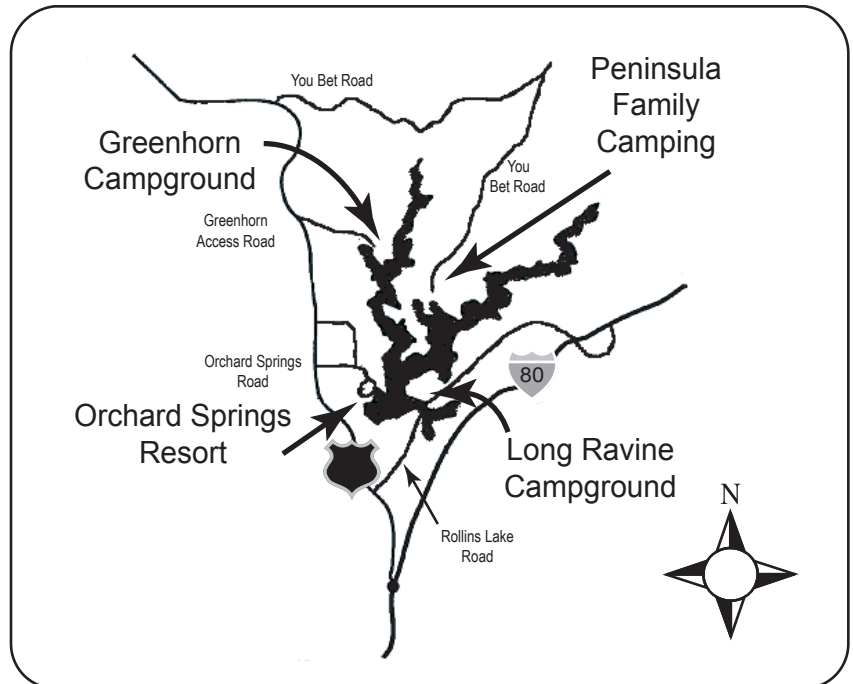

Nevada Irrigation District (NID)

Formed in 1921, NID has grown and matured into a diversified water agency that is meeting the needs of an expanding and changing district population. During the 1920s, NID obtained many important water rights that it still holds today and the district continues efforts to exercise and protect its water rights. The acquisition of land to store and deliver water was a very important step in the district's development. Another important milestone occurred in 1966 when NID entered into hydroelectric energy production with the completion of the \$65 million Yuba-Bear Power Project. Today, NID supplies water to homes, farms and businesses. On its way to the foothills, NID water produces electricity and provides public recreation.
